Go over the pit stops from your lessons. These are a good source of questions and have feedback (what you did well) and feedforward on (how you can improve)

Be Organised

Have a list of topics that you need to revise.
Keep it up to date, regularly checking off what you know.
Have a timetable of what you want to do and when.

Work Together

Work with a friend – teach them topics they are unsure with. Get them to teach you topics you need help with.

GET A CALCULATOR AND LEARN HOW TO USE IT

Flashcards

Create some flashcards of key formula and processes. Ensure that you look at them regularly.

You can buy a WJEC revision guide from your maths teacher.

Answer questions

Answer as many exam style questions as you can. Make sure that you check them against answer to find out areas for improvement.

Attend as many extra sessions with a maths teacher as possible.
